 President – Welcome to the final NCASA meeting of the calendar year. We meet next January 6<sup>th</sup> to mainly focus on the voting of our Award Recipients.

Carolinas Cup was an exceptional event. 82 teams overall utilizing every field and time slot available on Saturday. Carolinas Cup is a well-managed event, there are a lot of Thank Yous to go around.

Thank you to Darius and Cindy for their hard work and commitment, to Donna Langdon for all the behind the scenes assistance with registration, player verification and rostering, Alex Vidaurri for her contribution to the operation and helping with the Women's program, to our South Carolina partners Sofia and Devis Hernandez for all of their continued support and to the entire Eisenbraun family that pitched in with much appreciated help before, during and after the tournament.

There are several proposals on tonight's agenda, and I want to give enough time for proper discussions.

• Executive Director – November is a busy month as preparation for the Carolinas Cup is the dominant focus. Covering all details from referees, their lodging and meals, trophies, trainers, schedules, Championship shirts and sellable apparel, ordering captain's gifts and interfacing with Truist to see to it we are all on the same page. We held zoom calls for each division, giving teams two opportunities to join the call and learn more about the expectations the tournament has of its captains and players.

In addition to the Cup, there was still the managing of D&A hearings, submitting all finances in a timely manner so our CPA has enough time to prepare our financial statement, following up on insurance claims and taking steps towards NCASA's 2025 AGM.

   Also, working on registrations number with TeamPass as we get closer to the end of the year.
   Working with TeamPass to create a player registration report that can be automatically downloaded is proving harder than it seems on the surface, given the uniqueness of each league. Then there is chairing the election committee.

#### Permitting Players Under Age 18 to Participate in NCASA-Sanctioned Activities

Whereas, the NCASA by-laws require a player to be a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age to apply for membership with NCASA, and

Whereas, this requirement was imposed in response to concerns over the impact of SafeSport requirements on NCASA and/or Affiliates permitting players younger than 18 years of age to participate, and

Whereas, prior to SafeSport, some NCASA Member Leagues chose to permit a small number of players under age 18 to participate, and

Whereas, other USASA state associations and other USASA member organizations continue to allow players younger than 18 years of age to participate while maintaining compliance with SafeSport requirements, and

Whereas, NCASA and some NCASA Member Leagues may wish to permit players younger than 18 years of age to participate in appropriate circumstances, and

Whereas, changes to the NCASA By-laws require a two-thirds vote of Council members present and voting at an officially called meeting,

Be it resolved that the NCASA Board of Directors recommend the following actions be approved by the Council at the Annual General Meeting to be held in January 2025:

1. Strike the text of NCASA By-Laws, Article II – Membership, Section 3, and replace it as follows:

Application of membership by individuals to Affiliates or to NCASA must be submitted through NCASA's approved electronic registration process under signature of the applicant. Players must be a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age to apply for membership with NCASA.

Application of membership by individuals to Affiliates or to NCASA must be submitted through NCASA's approved electronic registration process under signature of the applicant. Players must be a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age to apply for membership with NCASA, unless the Affiliate through which they are registering has informed NCASA that it has chosen to permit players younger than eighteen (18) years of age to participate and the player has completed all waivers required by the Affiliate and/or NCASA. No players younger than sixteen (16) years of age may apply for membership with NCASA.

2. Strike the text of the NCASA Player Registration Policy, Section 3 Player Registration, and replace it as follows:

# Players must be a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age to register.

Players must be a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age to register, unless the Affiliate through which they are registering has informed NCASA that it has chosen to permit players younger than eighteen (18) years of age to participate and the player has completed all waivers required by the Affiliate and/or NCASA. No players younger than sixteen (16) years of age may register.

3. Instruct NCASA to amend its SafeSport Policy no later than its April 2025 Board meeting to ensure that NCASA and its Member Leagues remain in compliance with SafeSport if players younger than eighteen (18) years of age are allowed to participate. At a minimum, NCASA will amend its SafeSport Policy, Section 4 Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy, to include appropriate provisions for interacting with minor athletes.

NCASA also will revise its policies to (i) require that Affiliates wishing to permit players under the age of eighteen (18) have in place appropriate SafeSport policies and (ii) describe how compliance with these requirements will be monitored & enforced. As part of these policies, NCASA will require that prior to a player under the age of 18 being able to participate in an Affiliate's matches, each Board Member of the Affiliate and each player on the same team as the player under the age of 18 must complete the required SafeSport training and submit their certificate of completion to NCASA.

4. No Affiliate may permit a player younger than eighteen (18) years of age to participate before NCASA has amended its SafeSport policies (as required above) and the Affiliate has adopted appropriate SafeSport policies in compliance with NCASA's requirements.

### **Definition of Registered Player for AGM Voting Strength**

Whereas, the number of voting representatives for each Affiliate at the NCASA Annual General Meeting (AGM) is determined by the Affiliate's player registrations, and

Whereas, the NCASA By-laws specify that player registrations for determining Affiliate voting power are based on actual payments received by NCASA, and

Whereas, NCASA's practice has been to interpret this provision by assigning a player registration to the Affiliate through which the player first registers in a registration year, even if the player subsequently registers with another Affiliate during the same registration year, and

Whereas, another method for counting player registrations would be to give credit for a player registration to each league to which a player registers during a registration year, even though the NCASA player registration fee is paid only once,

Be it resolved that the NCASA Board of Directors makes the following recommendations to the Council for approval at the Annual General Meeting to be held in January 2025:

- 1. For purposes of Council voting strength, a player shall be counted as a registered player of each NCASA Affiliate league to which that player registered, as described and implemented more fully below:
- 2. Strike the text of NCASA By-laws Article III, Section 2, and replace it with the following:

Each Affiliate's player registration number at the end of the previous calendar year based on actual payments received by NCASA shall be used to determine that Affiliate's voting power.

The voting power of each Affiliate shall be based on the Affiliate's total number of registered players during the previous calendar year. The term "registered players" shall refer to those persons who (i) registered to an Affiliate league and paid the league fee; and (ii) also registered and paid for an annual NCASA Player Pass. The term "registered players" does not include persons for whom the annual NCASA Player Pass fee is refunded.

#### 3. For purposes of clarity:

NCASA will consider a player to still be a "registered player" if a NCASA Affiliate issues a refund of its league fee to a player, but the annual NCASA Player Pass fee is not refunded.

A "guest player" shall be counted as a "registered player" of each NCASA Affiliate to which that player registered.

# **Approval of New Annual NCASA Award**

Whereas, the NCASA Board has indicated its desire to create a new NCASA Award to be presented to a deserving winner annually, and

Whereas, the award is designed to recognize individuals who contribute to the success of their local league

Be it resolved that NCASA present a new award annually "In Recognition of the Unsung Contributors Who Make North Carolina Soccer Leagues Thrive"; and

Be it further resolved that nominations for this award will be made only by current league leaders.
